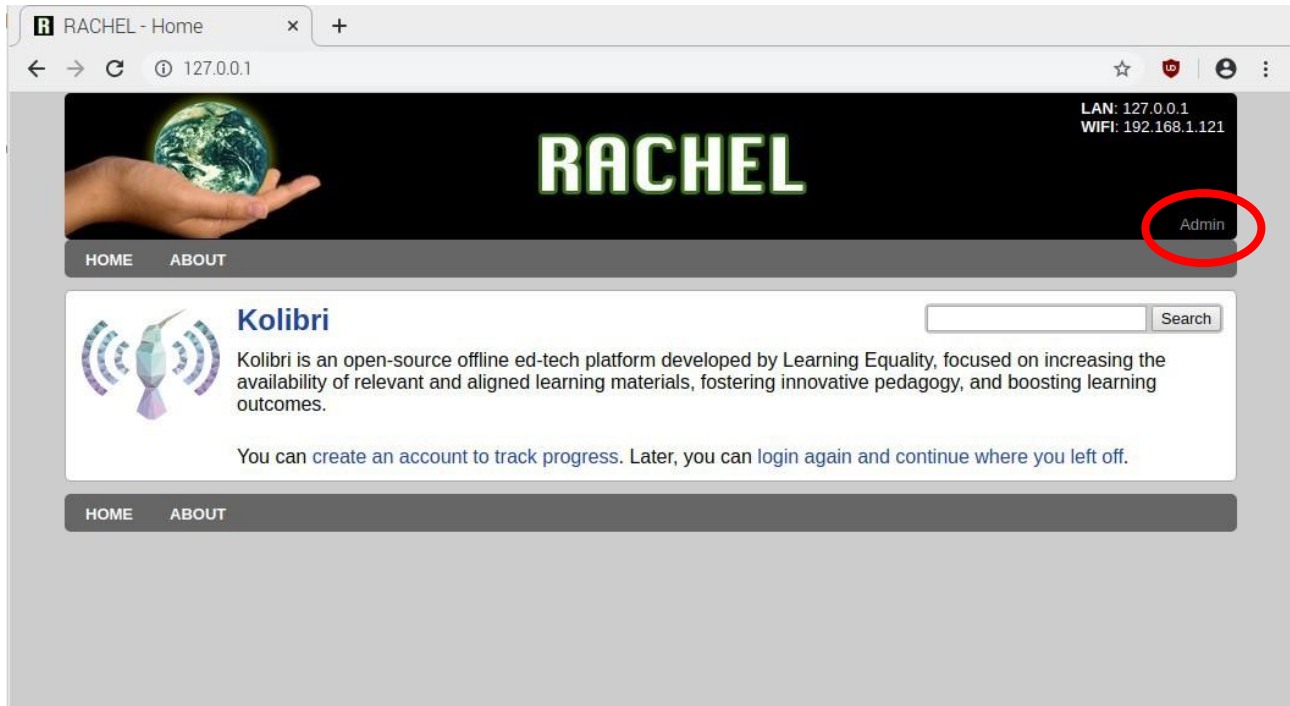


Shutting Down RACHEL Pi

Shutting down properly is essential if you want to ensure the smooth running of your system.




You do this by logging into the **Admin** area on the Home Page. On the bottom right of the banner click on the Admin button
